





- Offered as a Senior level 2, 3 and 4 credit options
- Opportunity to explore tentative career choices, gaining valuable work experience, Identifying and strengthening essential skills and employment skills through on the job training
- Students are able to work with equipment not available at school
- Make a smoother transition from school to work or post-secondary education
- Develop confidence and self-reliance as well as a better understanding of community partners available to them
- Earn secondary school credits while gaining practical job experience
- Possibility of future employment with the company



Student Selection Criteria for COOP

- Be at least 15 years of age in Grade 11
- Earned at least 15 credits
- Select 2, 3 or 4 credit Coop in student course selection
- Complete an online Co-op Application Form (found in myBlueprint during course selection)
- Secure and submit 2 teacher references
- Successfully complete an interview with a member of the Co-op Department




