- 2. Your Student Activity Fee (or printed School Day confirmation).**


Important Information

- If you are taking GLC20/CHV20 or CHC2D/P in summer school- DO NOT SELECT THESE ON YOUR MYBLUEPRINT COURSE SELECTION- choose another elective instead and leave a note in your course planner
- Please consult with your Guidance Counsellor before registering for a course in Summer School



LEARNER PROFILE






Pathways for Academic Math Students

What is AP Capstone?

AP Capstone ensures that the diversity of each classroom matches the diversity of its school.

AP Capstone Program

Grade 10 Seminar (ENG2DY2/CHC2DY2)

- AP Capstone is an innovative program from the U.S. College Board that uses an inquiry framework to equip students with the independent research, collaborative teamwork, and communication skills that are increasingly valued by universities.
- AP Capstone is built on the foundation of two AP courses — AP Seminar (gr. 10) and AP Research (gr. 11)
- AP Seminar is a prerequisite for AP Research; completing AP Seminar and all its required assessment components is necessary for students to develop the skills to be successful in AP Research.
- In AP Seminar, students are assessed with two through-course performance tasks and one end-of-course exam; all three assessments are summative and will be used to calculate a final AP score (using the 1–5 scale) for AP Seminar.
- In AP Research the following year, students are assessed on a 4000-5000 word Academic Paper, Presentation and Oral Defense; there is no exam in this course.

AP Capstone Program
